Remembering Nagasaki During his visit to Japan in 2019 Pope Francis condemned the unspeakable horrors of nuclear weapons, urging world leaders to end the stockpiling of nuclear weapons saying it offered their nations a false sense of security. This year Pax Christi will be joining peace activists around the world to remember the 76th anniversary of the dropping of the bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki on the 6th and 9th August 1945 when up to 226,000 people were killed instantly. Radio-active rain poured down on the city and ground temperatures reached 4000 degrees centigrade burning to death many of the survivors of the initial blast. By 1950 more than 340,000 people had died as a result and generations were poisoned by radiation; cancers caused by the radiation affected countless others, and their children, causing years of misery. Homes, schools and livelihoods were destroyed and communities ruined.

On 16 March 2021 the Prime Minister announced that the UK's nuclear warhead stockpile would increase by more than 40 per cent - meaning the stockpile could be as high as 260 warheads by the middle of the 2020s. Each one of those warheads is around eight times more powerful than the bombs dropped on Japan; they have the capacity to kill millions of innocent people and generate catastrophic consequences for God's creation. As a signatory to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty, the UK is legally obliged to negotiate the reduction of their nuclear arsenals towards their eventual abolition. The decision to expand the warhead stockpile represents a clear breach of the treaty. In addition there is a risk that it could ignite an arms race between states with similar sized nuclear arsenals. Pax Christi is working with Christian CND and other peace groups to oppose this decision and continues to call for the elimination of nuclear weapons in the UK and around the world.
